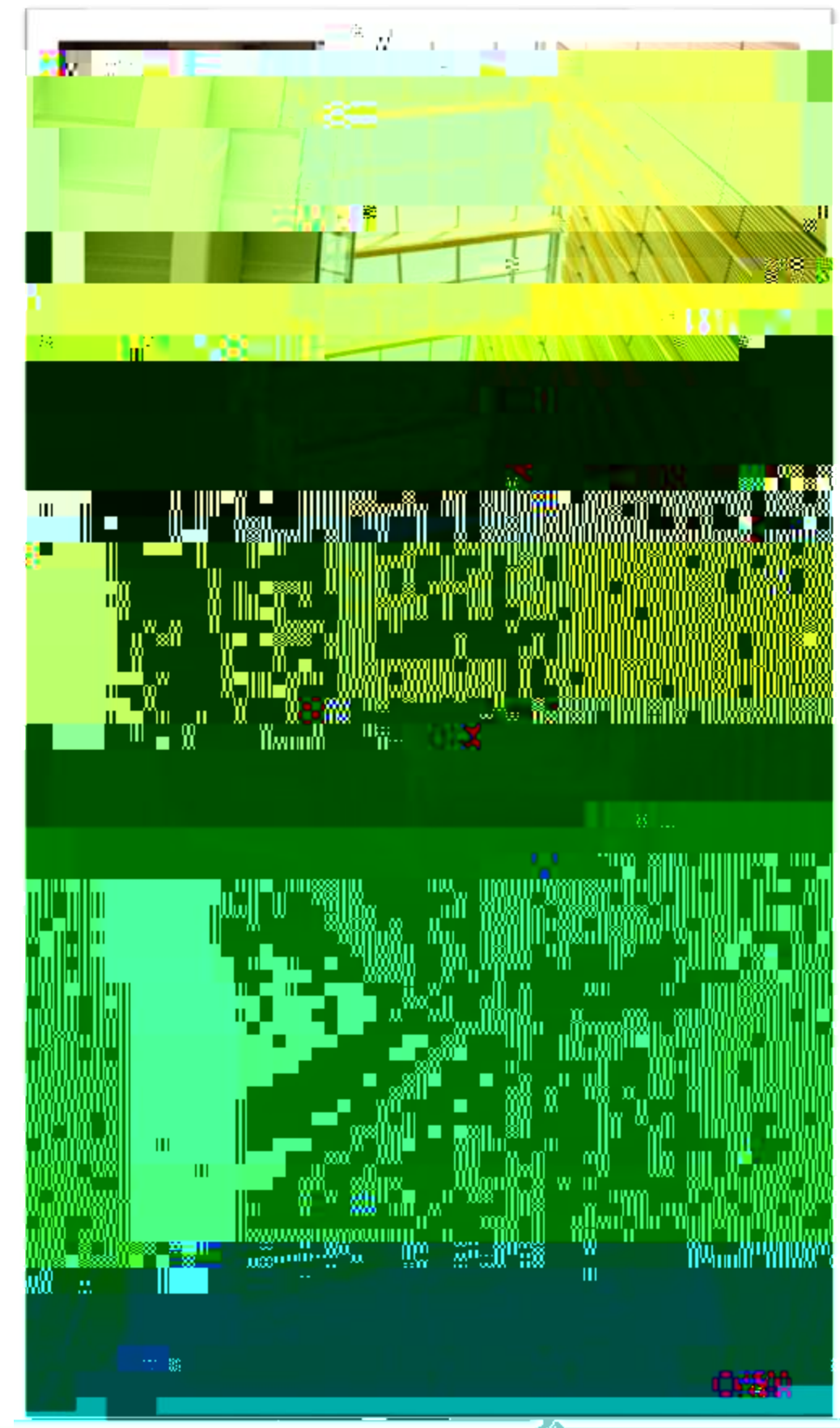
Camosun College is B.C.'s largest public college

Centre for Health and Wellness (CHW)

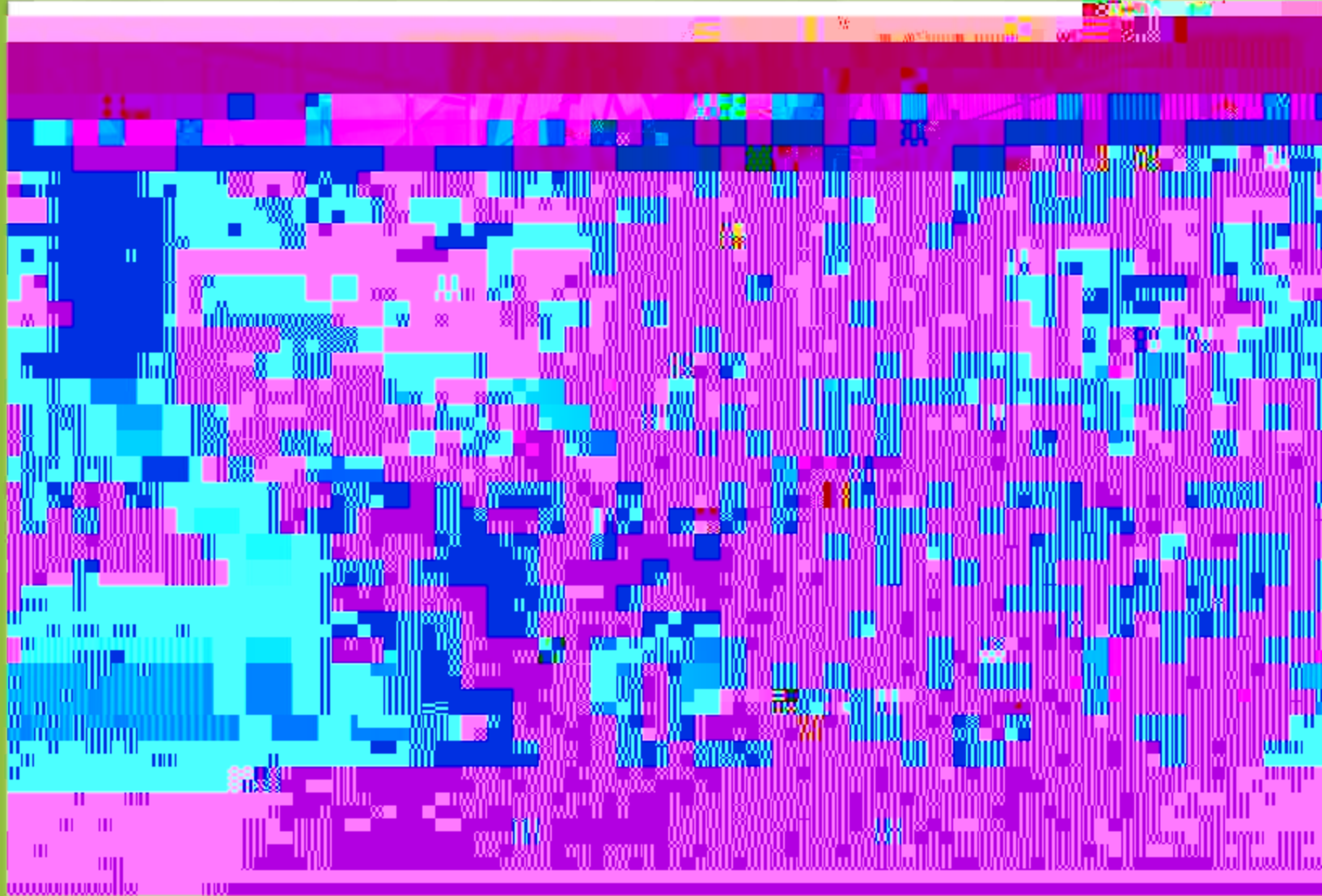
All HHS Programs except Dental are delivered at the CHW at Interurban Campus
